Technology Policy - NO UNAUTHORIZED USE OF CELL PHONES/EARBUDS IN CLASS

- I have **zero** tolerance for unapproved cell phone/smart watch/earbud use during class. Please keep devices/earbuds in your backpack. If I see you on your phone without approval, you will immediately receive an Electronic Device Violation as per school policy as outlined in the student handbook.
- Always treat your Chromebook/laptop with care. No food or water near the computers. Misuse of your Chromebook will mean that you lose the use of it during class. Misuse = roughness, surfing the Internet, viewing social media, playing games, etc.

Grading

- Major assignments will count for more points than minor assignments. I do not offer extra credit in lieu of assignments. Occasionally, small extra credit options may be offered to *all* students.
- You will <u>sometimes</u> have the option to revise assignments. Your grade has the potential to move up <u>one</u> letter grade from the initial score with <u>noticeable</u> revision.
- Assignments must be handed in on time to potentially receive full credit. If an assignment is late, the highest grade you might earn is a 70%. No late work is accepted after we have completed a unit. I operate on a simple point system using the school grading scale:

(A - 90 - 100%; B - 80 - 89%; C - 70 - 79%; D - 60 - 69%; F - 0 - 59%)

- Semester 1 Grade = Q1 (45%) + Q2 (45%) + Semester Test (10%)
- Semester 2 Grade = Q3 (45%) + Q4 (45%) + Semester Test (10%)
- I have zero tolerance for cheating.

As stated in the school handbook:

- "Cheating is defined as acting dishonestly in carrying out any assignment. It may include, but is not limited to, copying assignments, unauthorized use of electronic devices and other materials for tests, looking at someone else's test, plagiarizing, having someone else do your work, or other acts specifically prohibited by the teacher. (Using AI to generate work is cheating.)
- Cheating will result in a "0" for the test or work. The "0" will be calculated into the student's grade just as any other grade.
- The classroom teacher will administer this policy and has the responsibility of notifying parents, the counselor and the appropriate administrator." You will also

complete an Academic Integrity Contract which will go in your file.
